Unit	Description of Unit and Learning Targets
 Unit Title: Drawing <u>Essential Questions:</u> How do shapes impact art? How do lines impact art? 	 Students will be introduced to drawing as the foundation of all art. This unit will include guided drawing, free hand drawing, tracing and observational drawing. Learning Targets: I can create geometric SHAPES I can trace patterns I am aware of paper SPACE in art I can identify and create horizontal, vertical, zig zag, bumpy and wavy LINES
 Unit Title: Painting <u>Essential Questions:</u> What is the importance of the primary colors? How does color impact the look of an artwork? 	 Students will be introduced to painting as a fine arts medium. Students will paint a variety of materials throughout the duration of this unit. Learning Targets: I can create geometric SHAPES I can mix secondary colors from the primary COLORS with help I can mix colors with white to create VALUE I can experiment with different tools to paint
 Unit Title: Collage <u>Essential Questions:</u> What is the importance of spatial relationships in an artwork? How does craftsmanship impact a finished work? 	 Students will focus on appropriate amounts of glue, controlled cutting as well as becoming aware of the entire paper for a balanced composition. <u>Learning Targets:</u> I am aware of paper SPACE I can create smooth cut SHAPES I can fringe cut I can cut two identical SHAPEs by folding the paper I can use the appropriate amount of glue I can identify the top, bottom, middle, sides (short & tall) of the paper SPACE
Unit Title: Clay <u>Essential Questions:</u> • How does clay differ from other art	Students will be introduced to clay and its ability to change shape and texture through exploration. <u>Learning Targets:</u>

mediums?What purpose does texture have in a clay piece?	 I can create TEXTURE by pushing in clay I can bend clay to create a FORM I can smooth clay with water I can paint a rough TEXTURE of clay
 Unit Title: Fiber Essential Questions: What is the importance of fibers to our everyday life? How does texture play an important role in fibers? 	Students will be introduced to the use of textiles in art through foundational fibers work. Learning Targets: • I can create TEXTURE with paper weaving • I can place beads onto yarn/wire using a needle • I can create a basic 1-2 flap weaving
 Unit Title: Printing Essential Questions: How does printing make our everyday life easier? What are some ways to create prints? 	 Students will understand that printing is the most basic way to copy an image. <u>Learning Targets:</u> I can create symmetrical SHAPES by blot printing I can use found objects to create a print with TEXTURE I can ink a stamp with paint I can print using a stamp
Unit Title: 3D Essential Questions:	Students will be aware that some art is three dimensional and some art is two dimensional.
 What qualities are given to 3D artworks? How do artists create 3D art? 	 Learning Targets: I can identify a 3D FORM versus a 2D SHAPE I realize some art has four sides
