Concert Band

Course Description:

The curriculum for this course is developed from the Wisconsin Standards for Music. Band is an elective course open to all students who have completed middle school band through 8th grade and have continuously taken band, or by consent of the instructor. Members of the concert band participate in a range of activities including parade and football marching in the fall, evening concerts generally given in early December, late March, and May, pep band, solo and ensemble performances, and other performance opportunities. Band students are also required to attend bi-weekly lessons and complete individual performance assignments. Grading is determined through the mastery of 3 basic standards of music performance: Music Literacy, Contribution to the Ensemble, and Performance Interpretation and Accuracy.

The information in this course overview outlines what students should understand and be able to do by the end of the semester/year.

Mastery Standards:

Interpret and perform music from aural traditions and through standard and nonstandard notation with stylistic accuracy. (MP2.P.29.h)

Demonstrate well-developed ensemble skills while working collaboratively with other performers and the conductor in a rehearsal and performance. (MP2.P.30.h)

Be able to use conducting techniques to stop, start, and direct the band on simple exercises and musical compositions. Be able to play with good intonation within their sections Be able to play with good balance and blend within the ensemble. Be able to write critically about their musical performances using musical terms and analysis.
