Course Description:

The curriculum for this course is developed from the <u>Wisconsin Standards for Art and Design Education</u>. This is an elective introductory trimester drawing course. Students will be exposed to art materials, subject matter and techniques that relate to the creation of a drawn product. Units include linear perspective, portraits, contour line, mixed media, and still life. This class will also include art criticism and art presentation. This course will also include a brief overview of art history and art criticism. Grades are determined by skill-building assignments and created projects. The information in this course overview outlines what students should understand and be able to do by the end of the trimester.

 Essential Questions: What is the best type and style of line for each drawing I create? 	Learning Targets: Learn and demonstrate Blind and Modified Blind Contour line drawing. Draw objects using observation.
Unit Title: Figure Drawing	Students will
Essential Questions: • How can I revise my drawing to show the correct proportion?	 Learning Targets: Learn and demonstrate the gesture drawing technique to draw an adult figure with correct figure proportions. Create visual balance (The Rule of Thirds). Apply the principle of Pattern to a drawing. Use warm and cool colors to create contrast.
Unit Title: Animal Drawing in Oil Pastel	Students will
 Essential Questions: How can I use color to capture my subject's emotion or mood? 	Learning Targets: Demonstrate how to draw using simple shapes. Demonstrate Oil Pastel techniques. Demonstrate the use of value changes to create form in my drawing.
Unit Title: Linear Perspective Drawing	Students will
 Essential Questions: How do artists and designers learn from trial and error? How can my work demonstrate Unity? How can I apply the elements and principles of design to my drawings? What makes a drawing successful? 	Learning Targets: • Learn and demonstrate how to draw a form and create space using one point and two-point linear perspective.
Unit Title: Landscape in Chalk Pastel	Students will
 Essential Questions: How do artists and designers learn from trial and error? How can my work demonstrate Unity? How can I apply the elements and principles of design to my drawings? What makes a drawing successful? 	 Learning Targets: Demonstrate atmospheric perspective by using foreground, middle ground, and background to create depth in a drawing. Demonstrate media application/chalk pastel techniques and craftsmanship. Demonstrate how to blend colors and create value changes. Understand and apply color schemes to my drawing.
Unit Title: Self Portrait Drawing	Students will
 Essential Questions: How can I revise my drawing to show the correct proportion? 	 Learning Targets: Apply drawing strategies to demonstrate the correct proportions of my head and facial features. Demonstrate the use of multiple values and modeling to create the element of form in a self-portrait drawing.

	Demonstrate media application/graphite or charcoal techniques, and craftsmanship.
Unit Title: Portfolio and Reflection	Students will
Essential Questions: • Portfolio and Reflection	Learning Targets: Reflect on my artmaking and interpret personal growth. Reflect on artmaking to interpret areas for improvement. Create a personal written artist statement to discuss the intent and process of art and artmaking. I can identify and describe how I used the elements of art and principles of design used in my artwork.
