## **Reading Workshop**

## **Course Description:**

The curriculum for this course is developed from Wisconsin Standards for English Language Arts. This is an elective course where students read self-selected texts and become book bloggers. This course focuses on increasing the number of texts students read in a year. Students measure their reading pace, evaluate genre preferences, participate in book talks, and other activities that allow them to articulate their interest and understanding of the novels they choose to read. Students set their own reading goals and work to produce a product, a book blog, where they create relevant blog entries, including book reviews, author reviews, and other topical entries. On a daily basis, students will talk about what they are reading, read their books, and complete blog entries. The grade for this course is determined by the quality of the product, the book blog, and the blog entries and book reviews. The information in this course overview outlines what students should understand and be able to do by the end of the semester/year.
