The School District of Monroe is proud to announce that we've reached an exciting new milestone: achieving an "**Exceeds Expectations**" rating in the latest state report card! Even more impressively, all five of our schools showed overall score improvements, with three elementary schools earning a 5-star rating of "Significantly Exceeds Expectations," and both the middle school and high school advancing to the next rating scale category. This outstanding achievement reflects the hard work, dedication, and collaboration of our students, educators, families, and community who continuously strive for excellence.

The most recent State Report Card, officially released by the Wisconsin Department of Public Instruction today, is an integral part of the state accountability system. These comprehensive report cards encompass data across multiple indicators over the last three school years within four Priority Areas: Achievement, Growth, Target Group Outcomes, and On-track to Graduation. Districts and individual schools receive scores on a 0-100 scale in these priority areas, which are then combined to form an overall accountability score ranging from 0 to 100. It is important to clarify that this accountability score does not represent a "percent correct" measurement. Instead, it is an aggregate of four priority areas that are weighted based on demographics and school size. Based on this score, schools or districts are assigned one of five rating categories, ranging from Fails to Meet Expectations to Significantly Exceeds Expectations, each corresponding to one to five stars.


The Formula for Success



School Report Cards

Each of the three elementary schools demonstrated overall score improvements. The growth of students during their time in our elementary schools is arguably the best in the state, with scores ranging from 93rd to the 99th percentile. The elementary school staff continue to serve as a leader in achievement, curriculum adoption, professional development, and collaborative systems aimed at meeting the needs of all students. The scores of Abraham Lincoln Elementary, Northside Elementary, and Parkside Elementary demonstrate that Monroe has three of the very best elementary schools in all of Wisconsin.

Monroe Middle School and Monroe High School both realized an improvement in overall scores that improved their ratings. MMS moved up to Exceeds Expectations, while MHS improved to reach Meets Expectations. While both of these schools have enjoyed good achievement scores over the years, they have needed to focus on improving overall student growth and improve the performance of their lowest achieving students. These schools have taken a focused systems approach to address the needs of their students while also focusing on improved instructional practices. As a result, these schools have realized incredible improvement that the District believes will continue in the years to come.
