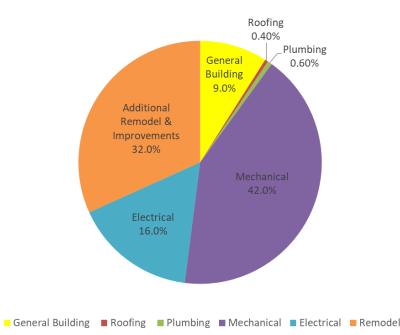

• DFC Narrowed to Two Options:

Option 1:

7-12 Grade Level Configuration

Combined Middle / High School

Existing High School Site

New Additions, Renovations, Demolition 60,000 sq ft

*Option 3:

9-12 Grade Level Configuration

New Building / New Site

Abe Lincoln Open

*Committee preferred Option 3, but recommends testing both options via the community survey.

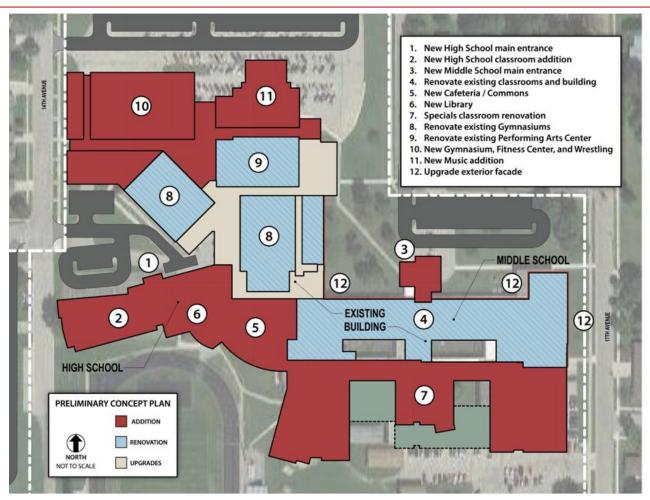
- Abe Lincoln would be closed
- Parkside and Northside would be reconfigured to PK-3 buildings
- Middle School would become a 4-6 Intermediate School
 - Cafeteria improvements, FACE and science spaces converted to classroom spaces, remodeling allowance

- High School would be remodeled in combination with new construction to create a 7-12 building
 - 2 schools under 1 roof
 - Separate entrances and offices
 - Renovate 144,500 sq. ft. and add 227,000 sq. ft.
 - Specialty areas used by all grades
- Project cost of \$86 Million (estimate)

PROPOSED OPTION 1 SITE PLAN (7-12 COMBINED MIDDLE / HIGH SCHOOL)



- Abe Lincoln would continue to operate as a 4K-5 school
 - Updates and renovations
- Parkside would continue to operate as a K-5 school
- Northside would continue to operate as a K-5 school
- Middle School would continue to operate as a 6-8 school
 - Cafeteria improvements, remodeling allowance
- New High School constructed at a new site to create a 9-12 building

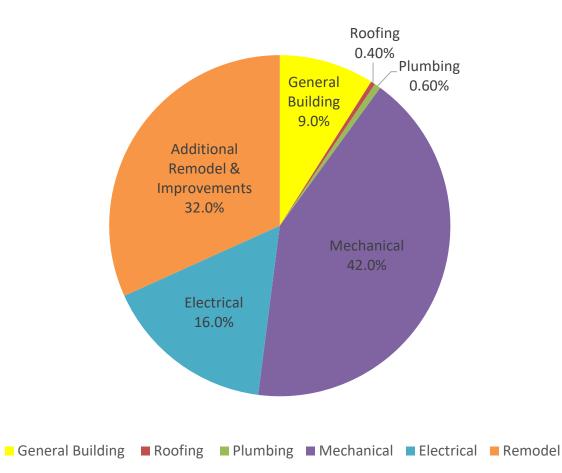
MILLION

- New 264,600 sq. ft. High School
- Close existing High School
- Project cost of \$88 Million (estimate)

POTENTIAL SITE FOR OPTION 3 - NEW HIGH SCHOOL

- Preferred location to build a new high school adjacent or near city limits
- Explore site options with private property owners
- Challenge is not identifying site during pre-referendum phase
- Cost of the land may vary, included in referendum costs
- Need to do our due diligence prior to referendum

General Building Issues

- Building envelope repairs
- Replace settling concrete & deteriorated asphalt
- Repair exterior wall leaks
- Repair foundation waterproofing & drain tile

Roof Issues

- Roof is in good condition
- Seal chimney

Fire Protection Issues

Sprinklers included (major additions may require adding sprinklers)

Plumbing Issues

- Add larger domestic water heater
- · Add valves to domestic water piping

Mechanical Issues

- Replace original air handlers
- · Replace original hot water/chilled water unit vents
- Provide separate HVAC unit for front office
- Replace the pumps
- Update to digital controls
- Duct cleaning & re-balance the building

Electrical Issues

- Replace original electrical service
- Add more electrical outlets
- Replace & expand data cabling
- Add new LED lighting
- Allowance for ground wiring

Potential Remodel & Improvements

- Secure entrance
- Classroom floors, ceilings and cabinetry replacement
- Gym floor replacement
- Updates to meet Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA)
- Collaborative & flexible classrooms

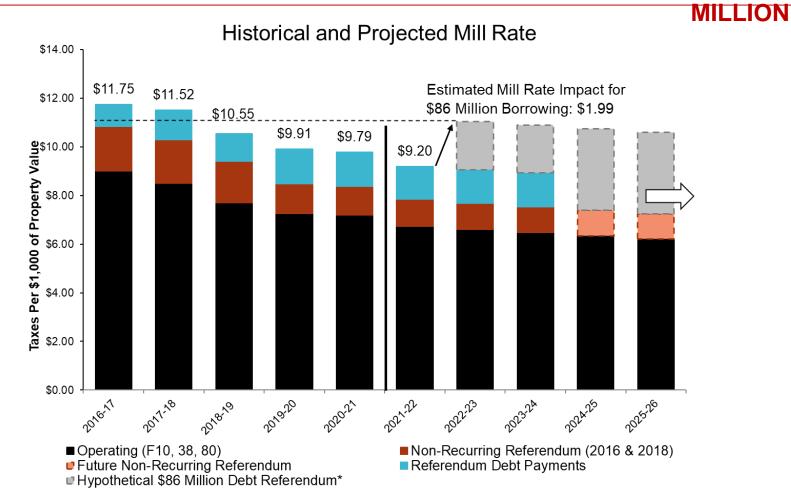

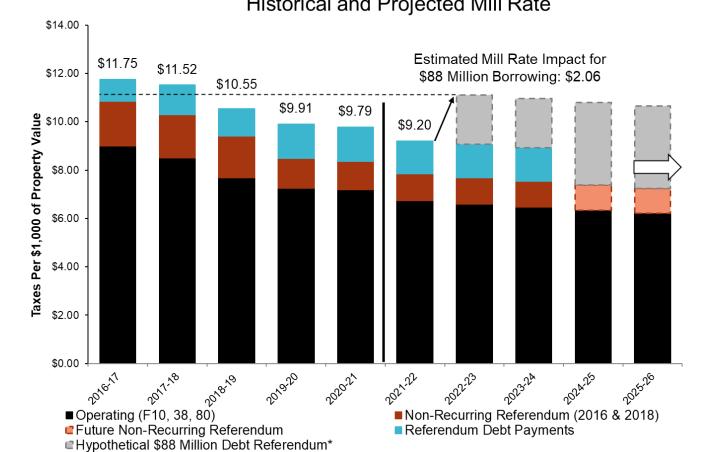

- Vendor: School Perceptions
- Survey development October December 2021, survey in January 2022
- Report results in February, approve and adopt resolution March 14 or 28
- Based on November 2022 tax impact
- Web-based survey platform with access control system
- Goal of the survey process:

Builds trust and credibility in the community

First chance to educate stakeholders about solutions

Collects data to inform the board on community tolerance

1. Board review recommendation from DFC

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Option 3 – DFC preferred solution
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Recommendation to survey the community – Option 1 & 3

- 2. Community engagement sessions to present high school option(s)
- 3. Community survey process through School Perceptions
- 4. Board finalize solution(s) for referendum November 2022
