Dear Parents/Guardians,

Welcome back! I hope you had a great summer. I am excited to share that for the upcoming 2024-25 school year, we will be implementing evidence-based grading with 35 staff members in grades 6-12. Your child will be taking at least one course using this grading system.

What is Evidence-Based Grading?

Evidence-based grading focuses on what students know and can do, similar to how elementary school teachers report learning. It provides a more fair and accurate representation of your child's abilities and growth while promoting student independence and ownership of their learning.

How Are Grades Determined?

Letter grades will still be assigned and will be determined by your child's proficiency level on each of the essential skills for the course. Below are the proficiency scale descriptors. The district proficiency scale is designed to provide clear feedback to students and families on the level of proficiency a student has demonstrated on a particular skill.

Courses have a minimum of 3 skills areas that all assessments will be organized under. Skill scores will be used in determining the grade following the table below.

How Will I Be Informed About My Child's Grade?

To monitor your child's performance and grades throughout the trimester, families will use a new gradebook system called OTUS. OTUS will allow you to see your child's scores on each piece of evidence and the essential skills for the course. Skill scores will be updated starting at week 4. Overall grades will be updated and can be viewed at weeks 6, 10, and 12. Look for more information in early September on how to access OTUS to monitor your child's progress.

Families will continue to use Skyward to monitor their child's learning for classes in a traditional gradebook. The overall grades for all courses can be viewed in Skyward at the end of the trimester.
