The late summer and fall have been a very productive time for students and staff involved in the many extracurricular activities offered in Monroe. Their dedication paid off

in big ways and is a great source of pride within the school district and greater community. Extra-curricular activities are an extension of the learning environment and are heavily focused on individual student interests, problem solving skills, time management, self improvement, competitive thinking, and of course, team work. Our students are able to have experiences in areas they are interested in and be part of something bigger than any one of them. It is a real world experience with real results. In addition to the high achievements experienced, we had many All-State Academic award winners.

The One Act Play titled, "The Play That Goes Wrong -High School Edition", qualified for and competed at the State competition on the UW Whitewater campus November 19 and knocked it out of the park! The Monroe team earned a Critics Choice Gold Award, Best Ensemble, Best Technical Theater, Best Director, and Best Acting awards were earned by Ashton Klemm, Owen Klemm, Bella Davis, and Simon Carus. I was able to attend the full two act play performed in the PAC and it was very near if not on par with many professional theater productions I have viewed. I would strongly encourage anyone hungry for top-guality theater to watch for and attend our productions. They are among the best in the state as was affirmed at UW Whitewater in November.

The Cheesemaker Football Team capped an undefeated season with a 35-13 win at Camp Randall Stadium in Madison for the WIAA Division 3 State Championship on November 18. In addition to 18 all-conference team selections, Isaac Bunker, Tucker Markham, Sean Rufenacht, and Keatin Sweeney earned All-Region honors. Keatin was also named Rock Valley Conference Back of the Year, joining Head Coach Toby Golembiewski and Assistant Coach Tom Witt as Rock Valley Conference Coaches of the Year. Isaac Bunker was named the State's Top Offensive Lineman as the Joe Thomas Award Winner; in addition to earning Top Offensive Lineman of the year for the Rock Valley Conference. Eight Seniors also earned Academic All-State honors. A group of motivated, focused, intelligent student-athletes being coached and prepared to perform at their highest levels over their time in the program provided the opportunity for this success and an attitude driven formula they can each apply to achieve success in the future.

The Boys and Girls Cross Country teams each qualified for the WIAA State Cross Country meet in Wisconsin Rapids on October 29. Both teams were Badger Conference Champions and our State competitors earned Academic All -State Honors. This talented group trained and competed as a team and by the end were peaking at their most competitive level. Steady improvement through the season produced some of the best results in the state.

Our Monroe-New Glarus Swim team was a very competitive unit throughout the season and gualified 4 events for the WIAA State Swim Meet in Waukesha on November 11th. The team is young and posted Personal Best times for each event they competed in this season. Congratulations, ladies!

The Girls Tennis program continues to grow in participation and competitiveness with over 30 student-athletes involved. Our Dance and Cheer teams lead our fan and student sections and were very entertaining during the fall season. Boys Soccer and Girls Volleyball worked through tough seasons against some very talented conference and non-conference opponents. The band and chorus concerts are happening after I write this, but I expect they will put on high quality and memorable performances going into the holiday season.

Monroe extracurricular activities have something for everyone and I strongly recommend taking in a winter sporting event, concert, or musical. We have amazing young people with amazing talents in our schools.

Community support for the referendum was outstanding and the Board of Education intends to build a high school educational complex which improves opportunities for many generations of Monroe students and families. The design planning and bid packet work will begin in the next few months. Updates to Abraham Lincoln Elementary and construction of a new high school on a new campus will be communicated during the planning and construction phases, more to come.

And the cast and crew of "The Play That Goes Wrong" One Act advanced to the State competition where they brought home 8 awards including Critics Choice.
